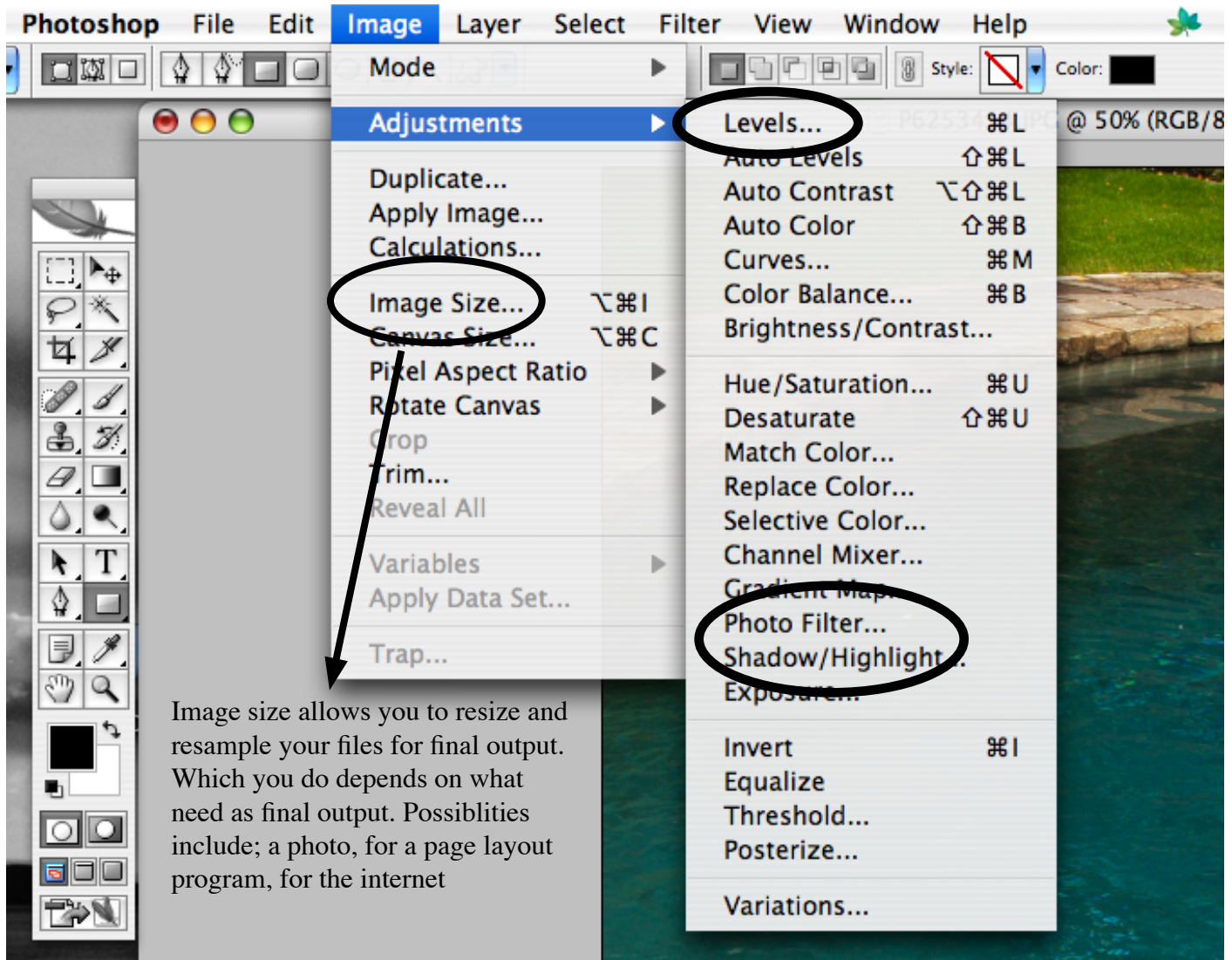


Image>Adjustments>..... these Menu items are used for making adjustments to the entire image to bring out the most information available, particularly for making adjustments in the tonal values (darks to lights) in the image. Photoshop breaks down value in three sections, shadows, midtones, and highlights.



Levels allow you to adjust the contrast and brightness in your image more precisely. You can adjust the shadow, highlight and midtone areas separately.

The Photo Filter command mimics the technique of putting a colored filter in front of the camera lens to adjust the color balance and color temperature of the light transmitted through the lens and exposing the film. The Photo Filter command also lets you choose a color preset to apply a hue adjustment to an image.

The Shadow/Highlight command is suitable for correcting photos with silhouetted images due to strong back-lighting or correcting subjects that have been slightly washed out because they were too close to the camera flash. The adjustment is also useful for brightening areas of shadow in an otherwise well-lit image.
